REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT

Saturday July 19th was our Invasion and also a day of sustained high winds that wreaked havoc on our floating concrete breakwater, breaking and pulling apart of the pilings and ripping bolts right through the piles. Repairs will be made to se-

cure the breakwater but it proves again that this breakwater is not sufficient for its intended purpose, a topic that is a major focus of the Long Term Planning Committee, and is slowly destroying itself. If there is any way you can make the next all Members Long Term Planning Committee meeting to be held at the Clubhouse at 7:00 pm on Tuesday July 29, 2014 please do your best to attend, your input is important and valued.



That same Saturday morning Member Ron Paziuk, new associate Member and diver Dwayne Blaeser and I redeployed a buoy in Ellison's south bay that had broken free a year or so ago, replaced another buoy that had a serious list to it and replaced a section of worn chain on a third, the other two buoys in this bay were inspected and are in satisfactory operational condition. From Ellison we then made our way to the south end of Fintry with the intended purpose of redeploying two of the four buoys that had broken free and inspect the condition of the other two however the wind and wave conditions coming directly from the south made it impossible to perform our intended tasks so we called it a day and will attempt this an-

other day.

Thanks to the efforts of a silent few of our Members over the years, too many names to mention here, and thanks to the availability of our Club Boat the costs to our Membership of maintaining these invaluable assets are minor. Without the efforts of these individuals and the availability of our Club Boat we would be faced with having to incur the substantial costs of hiring a commercial service or possibly removing the buoys altogether. Also, please remember that these buoys are available for use by not only our Members and Members the other Clubs on the Lake but also by members of the general public for day and overnight use – but not for unattended overnight moorage by anyone.

Recently we had the unfortunate occurrence where someone allegedly from our Club left a note on a MacGregor sailboat tied to one of our buoys at Ellison stating the buoys were for use only by VYC Members. This of course is not the case; as stated above it is the policy of the VYC to allow members of the general public to make use of our buoys for day and overnight moorage, just not




for long-term unattended moorage by anyone including our own Members (please visit our website http://vernonyachtclub.com/mooring-buoy-information/ for the VYC policy on mooring buoy use).

The owner of the MacGregor came to the Clubhouse and apologized to a couple of our Executive Members for using the buoy while camping on his boat with his family even though he mentioned there were no other boats on any of the buoys in the bay at the time when asked.

As an Executive we do our best to monitor abuses of these privileges by those few who would attempt to use our buoys as their own private mooring and if you believe someone is abusing this privilege please approach me or one of our other Executive Members with the details for the Executive to deal with.

Speaking of the public please be mindful and respectful of the fact that we do have neighbours, whether they are neighbours sleeping on their boats at the dock or neighbours in the homes and apartments close to our facilities. Our actions, especially after 11:00 PM, have a definite and immediate impact on the enjoyment of these people's lives. Music and voices near the water are amplified and travel further so please be cognizant of this fact if you are socializing on your boat later at night or, if you are leaving the docks after 11:00 PM please take the few extra seconds to



gently place your returnable drink containers <u>only</u> into the bins inside the Gatehouse and control the closing of the lids, don't' just let the lid drop to slam closed.

The same goes with placing your garbage and other non-returnable recyclable materials and containers into the large dumpster by the boat launch, letting this lid slam closed or throwing your bags of refuse into the dumpster makes an enormous amount of noise, the level of which is directly proportional to the hour it happens to be. And if you are a sailor, please remember to tie off your halyards away from the mast to a shroud with a bungee cord.

Anything we can do to show we are good and respectful neighbours goes a long way, especially when the time comes that we have to replace the breakwaters or do major improvements to the docks, and Clubhouse, they do get asked for their thoughts – so just remember the good ole golden rule: "do unto others as you would have them do unto you" and we'll all get along just fine.

Lastly, I wanted to touch on the use of a few of our other amenities we have available to us at VYC:

Parking:

Thanks to the foresight of earlier Members and Executives we are blessed with an incredible amount of on-site parking but as our Club continues to grow there have been times the past couple of years on busy weekends when there is no parking to be found. So please remember that parking in the paved lot and the small upper gravel parking area are restricted to vehicles belonging only to our Members and their guests; vehicles with trailers belonging to Members must back into a designated spot in the gravel area on the west side of the lot and never park on the paved area. All parking is available on a first come first serve basis so please always try to car pool as much as possible with your family and guests to reduce the pressure on this valuable asset we all too often take for granted.



Ice Machine:

Having the ice machine in the gatehouse is a wonderful convenience for many of us and the cost is more reasonable than buying from a service station or convenience store. If you make use of this service please be sure to remember and pay for your ice, especially if you are short of cash at the time you grab your ice. Oversights do happen but this is an honor system meant to breakeven to cover the cost of the ice and the power to run the freezer and a shortfall could mean we end up losing this convenience.

Power Consumption:



Please be cognizant of your power consumption during these hot days of summer if you are fortunate enough to have air-conditioning on your boat please turn it off when you leave. It can be an easy oversight to walk away and forget to turn the unit off after enjoying time on your boat, which results in unnecessary use of power.

Swimming in the Basin:

For obvious safety and liability reasons intentional swimming in the marina basin is strictly prohibited and for very good reasons. Firstly, if it is hot enough to tempt you to take a dip at the dock then there is likely increased boat traffic in and out of the basin while others are also trying to take advantage of the nice weather and second, there is an extreme amount of power circulating up and down the docks and to many of the boats tied up to those docks. Any power leakage from a cord that has inadvertently drooped into the water in close proximity to where you are swimming could potentially immobilized you and result in your drowning.



Please be safe and make the most of the rest of you summer.





Long Term Planning Committee ~ The Long Term Planning Committee had a meeting in the morning on July 9<sup>th</sup> and the Committee is hosting an all-member "VYC Open House Forum" on Tuesday July 29th at 7:00 pm. All members all welcome to attend and discuss the future growth and development of our Club.

*Proposal for Year End Change* ~ There are complications to our proposal to move the VYC Year End back a month. It was approved at the provincial level, but not approved at the federal level. The executive is continuing to work on this.

Maintenance Work on the Breakwater ~ The Section 9 Notification application for maintenance work on the north log breakwater was submitted June 24, 2014. The government has 45 days to respond before work can commence, it is anticipated Okanagan Pile Driving will be able to begin work mid to late August.

*VYC Janitorial Position* ~ 16 resumes were received for the part time janitorial position to replace MJ Watson who resigned effective June 30, 2014. Three were selected for an interview but none have been chosen for the position to date. In the interim our Staff is dividing the duties.

Buoy Inspection Volunteer ~ New Associate Member Dwayne Blaeser has volunteered to annually inspect all mooring buoys belonging to the VYC. So far he has inspected all those at Agate Bay and found them to be in very good condition. He's also inspected the buoys at Fintry of which one was missing and the other was on the beach. Together with a work party he will deploy a buoy to replace the missing one and thoroughly inspect all the others at Fintry, making any other repairs deemed necessary.

Boats not Securely Tied ~ Fleet Captain, Al Cuttriss, together with the VYC Security Team will work with members whose boats are improperly tied to rectify the situation.

Ladies Night Success ~ The ladies night in June was the most successful ever with 60 women in attendance. Jay said that these events have increased revenue tenfold for those Thursday nights. The next Ladies night event will be held in September.


# On another note, the recycle bins ....




